### **Aims of the Club**

- To promote the game of cricket as a recreational sport within Mulbarton and adjacent areas.
- To provide opportunities where children can play and enjoy cricket in a safe, fair, encouraging and friendly environment.

### **Etiquette and Matches**

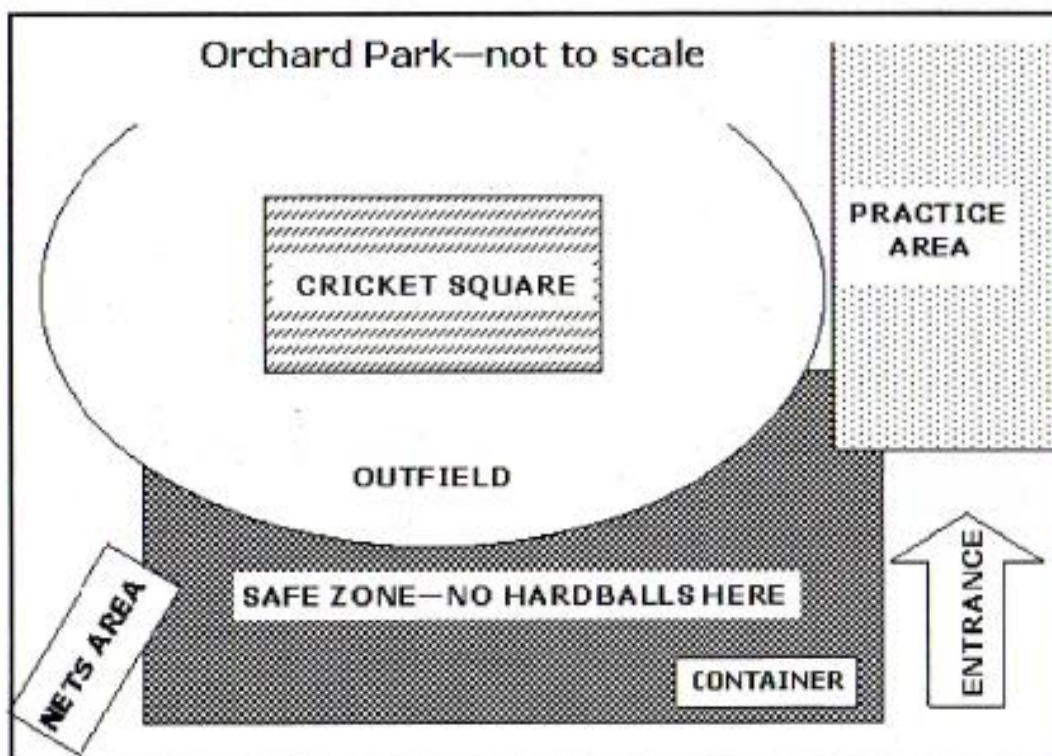
- If you are selected to play in a match you will receive an email or phone call.
- If you cannot play please let the Club know as soon as possible so that a replacement can be found.
- If the match is cancelled because of bad weather or for some other reason, you will be contacted by telephone.
- If you are playing please try to arrive at least 15 minutes before the start of the game.
- Remember all necessary equipment. Members are expected to provide their own white cricket trousers, shirt and suitable footwear.
- The required protective equipment shall be worn during training and matches. Boys must provide their own abdominal protector (box).
- Use the time prior to the start of the match to warm up and prepare.
- When playing in a match, members are expected when not fielding or batting, to support their team by watching the game with the spectators.
- Always clap a new batsman in and applaud a batsman's 50.
- Players and spectators must demonstrate good sportsmanship.
- At the end of an innings, clap the batsman off the pitch.
- The Umpires decision is final. Never question the Umpires decision however unfair the decision may seem.
- Shake hands with your opponents at the end of the match.
- Members are asked to respect the property of Mulbarton CC and other users of Orchard Park.
- Club equipment must be returned to the bag after training/matches.
- After matches please do not disappear immediately, there are always small jobs to be completed; collecting the boundary markers, packing the club bag, retrieving equipment etc.
- Please ensure that all of your kit is clearly named, we acquire a good deal of lost property over the season. If it is correctly named we can return it immediately, if not, it is more difficult to trace its owner.

### **Safety Guidelines**

All members need to be aware of the safety zone at Orchard Park regarding the use of hard balls:

- Hard cricket balls must not be used in the safe zone (see below).
- Players knocking up must use the nets or the practice area, hitting the ball away from spectators.

- When using the nets, players must be aware **at all times** of batsmen hitting the ball towards them.
- Batsmen using the nets must wear a helmet.
- When changing or talking players should be behind the wings of the nets and **not** in front.

### **Safeguarding**

Mulbarton Cricket Club is committed to ensuring all Children (i.e all persons under the age of 18 ) participating in cricket have a safe and positive experience.

### **Data Protection Act (1988)**
